The Condition of Muslim Entrepreneurs in India: In Changing Socio-Political Environment

A first attempt to understand Muslim Entrepreneurship in India. Based on 101 in depth interviews across 15 cities and 274 survey responses of Muslim Entrepreneurs across 25 cities, the report provides interesting insights on issues and challenges related to starting a business, managing a business, discrimination, finances, the covid pandemic and government support. It also highlights strategies used by these Muslim entrepreneurs for survival, to manage competition and cope with discrimination in business. The report explores the business practices of traditional business communities like Khoja, Bohra and Cheliya. It reveals how Muslim Entrepreneurs are using Halal Certification, Islamic Finance and Sharia Based Investments. The report also touches on issues related to women entrepreneurs and startups started by young entrepreneurs from the Muslim community.
